

New Study Highlights Public Housing and Secondhand Marijuana Smoke



"It's everywhere!" says Malia Vazquez, 13, who lives at the Fulton Houses complex in Chelsea. "It travels down the staircases. It's in the elevators. It's in the hallway. It's downstairs inside the lobby."

"We did find that it was much, much more common to experience marijuana smoke in NYCHA housing in particular," says Karen Wilson, MD, MPH, with Mount Sinai Medical Center.

67% of residents reported smelling marijuana smoke (67%) in their home over the past year, higher than reports of smelling cigarette smoke (60%).

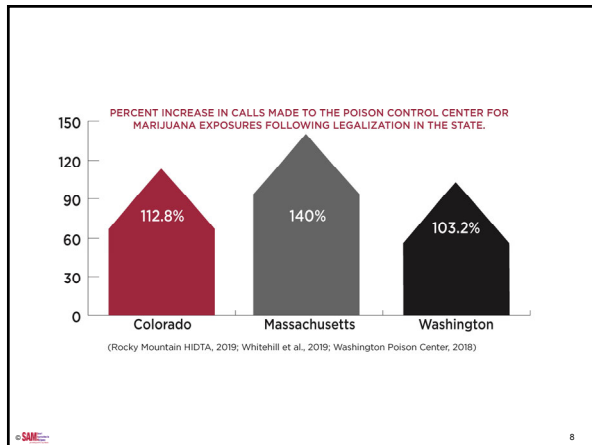

Pesticides and Pot: What's California Smoking?

An NBC4 i-Team investigation found evidence suggesting that pesticides could be present in a lot of marijuana legally sold in California

Steep Hill Labs found 41 out of 44 samples, **93 percent**, tested positive for pesticides, at levels high enough that those products would've been banned for sale in some other states that currently regulate the use of pesticides in marijuana products.

"It appears pesticides are very widely used" on California's marijuana crops, said Dr. Don Land, a UC Davis chemistry professor who is Steep Hill's chief scientist.



"It was surprising that so many (samples) had so much contamination."

Legalization is Unlikely to Diminish the Power of Drug Cartels and the Illicit Market (1/2)

CARTELS ARE, IN REALITY, DIVERSIFIED BUSINESSES

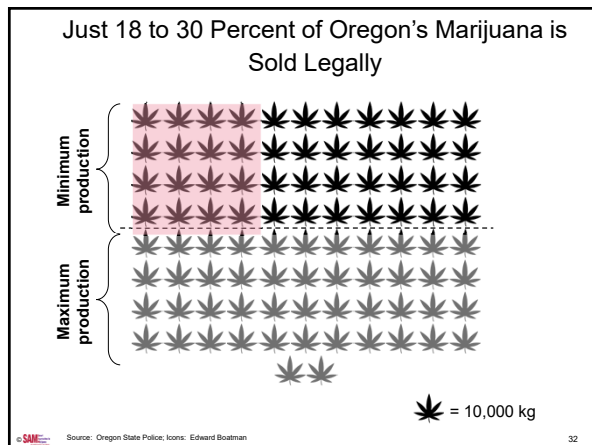
- “Drug cartels” are **diversified enterprises that include mining and pirated goods**
- Marijuana accounts for **only 15-25% of revenues** of drug trafficking groups
- More money is found in **other businesses, including legal ones**, than in selling marijuana
 - Estimates indicate **up to 50% of Zeta activities related to cigarette smuggling**
 - In 2014, **iron mining was the #1 source of revenue** for the former Knights Templar cartel

A HUGE ILLICIT MARKET EXISTS FOR TOBACCO

- Cigarettes are **the world’s most widely smuggled legal product**
- A **\$657 billion/year business** in 2009
- Provides **funding for organized criminal syndicates and terrorist groups** worldwide
 - In Canada alone, **~105 organized crime groups** are engaged in cigarette smuggling
 - Generates revenue for groups like **the Taliban and Hezbollah**


