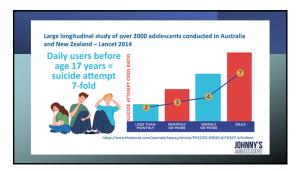

The Impact of Adolescent Cannabis Use, Mood Disorder, and Lack of Education on Attempted Suicide in Young Adulthood
- World Psychiatry, Oct. 2014

700 teens ages 12-15:
Marijuana use in those who weren't depressed before increased the risk of a suicide attempt 7.5-fold.

Any use of cannabis in the early adolescent period is a strong independent predictor of attempted suicide in young adulthood.

CO Teen Suicides Ages 15-18 Years Have Significantly Increased Since Marijuana Legalization

In 2004, there were 33 suicides. In 2020, there were 69.

The increase in suicides correlates with:

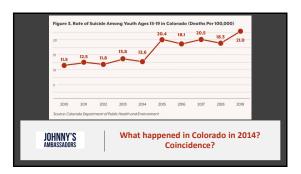
Broader use of THC by teens
Increased potency of THC
More easily accessible THC concentrates
