Super Skills for a Super Life! Be the Best Me, Drug Free!



Program Description

Sadly, we are discovering more and more children being exposed to THC and other substances starting even in 4th and 5th grade! This was quite a conundrum, because Johnny's story made them too sad. So, we decided to focus on resilience skills to create a THC-free and substance-free life.

This new course from Johnny's Ambassadors was created especially for late elementary (4th and 5th) and middle school (6th to 8th grade) students. It's a bit too "elementary" for high school (in our opinion). The students love our awesome 20-something speakers! The presentation builds intentions to avoid high potency THC products such as vapes and gummies and all substances that damage the brain.

This assembly is followed by a 5-module, online follow up classroom curriculum at no charge, with discussion questions, quizzes, and games to reinforce learning (optional). It is perfect for health classes that are required for all students.

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The Dangerous Truth About Today's Marijuana: Johnny Stack's Life and Death Story



Program Description

Laura Stack's son, Johnny, was a computer whiz with a perfect math score on the SAT and a 4.0 GPA. He started vaping THC at a party at 14 years old and died by suicide five years later after becoming delusional from dabbing. Soon afterward, Laura started a nonprofit organization, Johnny's Ambassadors, to educate parents and teens about the dangers of youth THC misuse. Three days before his death, Johnny issued his own warning about his THC usage, "Marijuana ruined my mind and my life." By weaving Johnny's tragic tale throughout this science-based presentation, Laura educates teens on how THC can disrupt brain development. Laura's presentation reviews the newest research on the potential harms of vaping, dabbing, and edibles in a teen-friendly way. They stay engaged and focused for the entire hour! Laura gives 200+ assemblies each year all over the U.S., up to three in one day.

Speaker Bio

Laura Stack is Johnny Stack's mom. After her son died by suicide because of his marijuana addiction and resulting psychosis, she now helps teens understand why today's high-potency THC products can cause problems with brain development, mental illness, and suicidality. Before Johnny died, Laura was a speaker and author for 30 years. Now, Laura sees it as her responsibility to share Johnny's warning with other teens to keep them from following Johnny's path. 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Why You Should Be #THCFree: The Brain, Body, Behavior, B.S., and Better Decisions



Program Description

Laura has developed a new THC prevention presentation for young people ages 16 to 22, specifically for junior/senior high school and college students. This was created by popular demand due to the rampant use of THC in college and the misnomer that it's safe (the brain is still forming until 25-30 years old). Laura's youngest son was in a fraternity, so she understands this culture well. Laura grew up on the Air Force Academy (her father is a retired Colonel), so she understands the college culture well.

Laura will talk in very plain language about the misinformation out there today about the use of THC in young people. She will outline the research and science behind why it shouldn't be used until the age of 30, weaving in more details about what happened to Johnny with photos and videos. This talk shows photos of drugs and videos that can potentially be upsetting to younger audiences and is not appropriate for under 16. It is particularly appropriate before prom for junior/senior high as it discusses drugged driving and the co-use of other substances. It's also a great fit for campus prevention presentations at college (tested for the D1 football team at Alabama).

If your students already saw Laura as middle and young high schoolers, this talk can be Part 2. If your mature high school/college audience has not seen the Part 1 presentation, Laura will start with a condensed high-level review. Before the new material, it gives a high-level review of THC definitions, potency calculations, teen brain formation, CB1 receptors, and THC interaction. It can also be used at youth and prevention conferences as a half-day workshop (showing part 1 and then part 2).

for Older High School and College

Objectives

1. The Brain (development, driving, depression, anxiety, mental illness, psychosis and suicide)
2. The Body (receptors, heart and lungs, CHS - vomiting, sleep, fertility)
3. The Behavior (reasons for using, use of other drugs, impulsiveness, laziness, aggressiveness, truancy and absenteeism, lower earning potential)
4. The B.S. (it's natural, it's not as bad as alcohol, you can't overdose, it's not addictive, helps you chill out, it's medicine)
5. The Better Decisions (healthy coping mechanisms, do things that increase anandamide, learn refusal skills, create your future as a young adult)



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The Dangerous Connection Between Youth THC Use and Suicidal Thinking, Attempts, and Suicide



Program Description

Laura Stack's 19-year-old son, Johnny, died by suicide after five years of heavy THC use. What is the connection to youth THC use and suicide? In Colorado, the #1 cause of death in youth ages 15-18 is suicide, and the #1 substance found in their toxicology reports is THC (35%).

In this presentation, Laura Stack discusses Five Ways THC is Associated with Increased Suicidality, using her son as an example with ample peer-review research studies. She also discusses the Gifts of Grief and how she survived her son's suicide.

Suicide Prevention Conferences

Five Ways THC is Associated with Increased Suicidality:

1. Cannabis-derived medications are known to increase the risk of suicidal thoughts or behavior in patients taking these medications.
2. THC can trigger Cannabis-Induced Psychosis (CIP). Many studies have confirmed that the risk of suicide in patients with first-episode psychosis (FEP) is high (delusions, self-harm, command voices).
3. CIP (early age of onset, high frequency, high potency), can trigger schizophrenia. Suicide is the largest contributor to the decreased life expectancy in individuals with schizophrenia.
4. THC use can lead to the onset of mental illnesses, including depression and anxiety. There is a high rate of suicide in individuals with mental illness.
5. THC use can lead to the decrease of serotonin, a neurotransmitter found to be lower in the spinal fluid of persons who died by suicide

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The Causal Link Between Youth THC Use and Psychosis: The Dangerous Truth About Today's Marijuana



Program Description

THC use (vapes, dabs, smokes, edibles) can affect brain development, particularly during the critical period of adolescence through the mid- to late-20s. This is also the period when psychotic disorders typically emerge, and there's growing evidence associating the two. Recent studies show that the more potent the THC product used, the more frequent the use, and the earlier the age of consumption, the greater the risk of psychosis. Physicians have seen a rise in chronic psychotic disorders, such as schizophrenia, in which they believe youth THC use was a contributing factor. In this session, you'll learn how today's high-potency THC products cause greater rates of addiction, brain changes, and mental illness in our youth.

Laura Stack is Johnny Stack's mom and the Founder & CEO of the nonprofit, Johnny's Ambassadors Youth THC Prevention. In the business world, Laura was known by her professional moniker, The Productivity Pro®. For thirty years, she was a Hall-of-Fame professional speaker, corporate spokesperson for many major brands, and bestselling author of eight previous books on employee productivity.

But then on November 20, 2019, Laura suddenly acquired the undesired wisdom of knowing what it's like to lose one's child. Her 19-year-old son, Johnny, died by suicide after becoming psychotic from dabbing high-potency THC concentrates. He first used marijuana at 14 years old when it became legal in Colorado.

Laura's world took a 180. She filed for and received 501c3 nonprofit status for Johnny's Ambassadors, Inc., with the mission to educate parents, teens, and communities about the dangers of today's high-THC marijuana on adolescent brain development, mental illness, and suicide. She wrote the bestselling book about Johnny's life and death story, *The Dangerous Truth About Today's Marijuana: Johnny Stack's Life and Death Story*. Described as a woman with unstoppable drive and unwavering purpose, Laura hopes to help other teens, parents, and all adults who work with teens by honestly and boldly sharing Johnny's story of his high-potency marijuana addiction, psychosis, and suicide.

The devastating loss of her child gives Laura a powerful voice and a platform for change. Laura sees it as her responsibility to share Johnny's warning to prevent other families from having to go through what she did and save other young lives from the harms of marijuana. Laura now travels around the U.S. with her husband, John, Johnny's dad, speaking 200+ times a year at school assemblies and conferences on preventing youth THC use.



Laura is the recipient of the Drug-Free America Foundation's Moxie Award for protecting youth from substances, the Leadership in Advocacy Award from the National Speakers Association, and the American Association of Suicidology's Loss Survivor of the Year Award. Johnny's Ambassadors is a national community partner of the Drug Enforcement Administration. Johnny's story has been told in countless media, including People Magazine, the New York Times, the Wall Street Journal, the Epoch Times, the Ingraham Angle, the Untold Story with Martha MacCallum, PBS, and on Dr. Phil.

By sharing Johnny's own warning about his marijuana use, "Marijuana ruined my mind and my life," Laura is determined to start a movement to prevent youth and young adult THC use.

Laura lives with her husband in south Denver, Colorado, and has two surviving adult children and two grandchildren.

Johnny's Ambassadors mission is to educate parents and teens about the dangers of today's high-THC marijuana on the developing adolescent mind and get them to #StopDabbing.

What is dabbing? Dabs are marijuana extracts (shatter, wax, budder are some examples) made by pouring a solvent such as butane, ethanol, propane, or carbon dioxide over marijuana, which allows THC to leave the plant material and dissolve into the solvent. This concentrated THC solution is then filtered and placed in a tray. The result of the extraction is sticky oil that typically appears bronze in color. It's not a plant and is highly potent, containing up to 99% THC. Dabs are typically heated on a hot surface and the vapors are inhaled through a dab rig or dab pen.

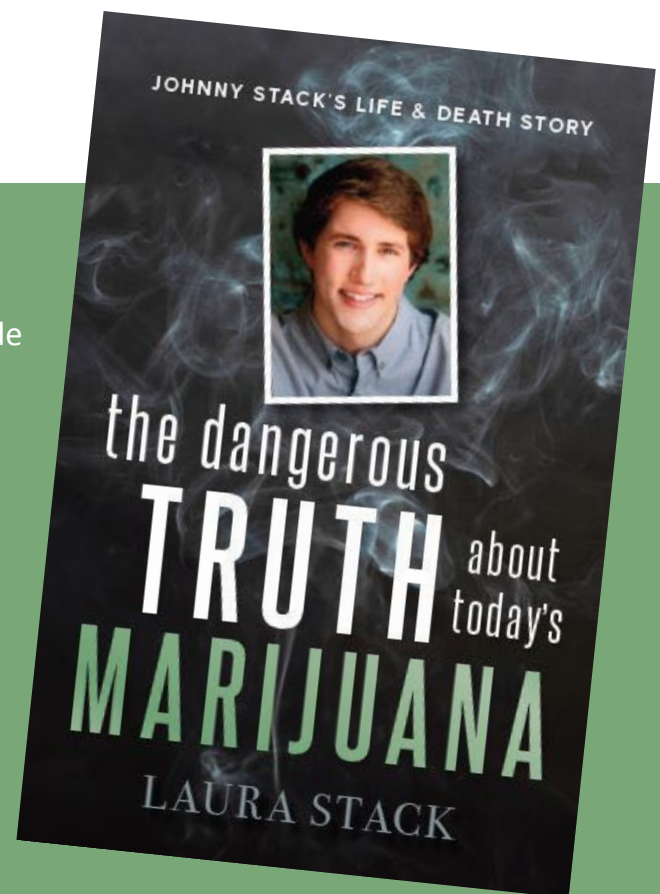
